K-5 SCHOOL SUPPLY LIST FOR 2020-2021

GENERAL NOTES: If you cannot locate Clorox or disinfectant wipes we understand. If you can find them and are able to purchase extra for those that cannot purchase them we would appreciate it. We will need these more than ever this year.

- ◆ The school purchases textbooks and a few additional items for classroom use, but parents are responsible for purchasing the items listed below. If you have questions about specific items, you are urged to contact the teacher of that grade.
- ◆ *The lists below are minimum requirements for each grade. Individual teachers may request additional items. They will indicate this in their classroom letters, which are issued on Monday or Tuesday of each week. During the school year, the teacher will inform you if any item needs to be replenished.*
- ◆ All supply items should be brought to school on the first school day. FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL – September 1, 2020. Please label them with the student's name or initials.
- ◆ All clothing and other personal belongings (sweaters, jackets, boots, tennis shoes, etc.) should be well labeled with the student's name or initials.
- ◆ **FOR Elementary P.E. CLASSES:** Students will not be required to have an extra pair of tennis-type shoes at school for P.E. classes, but parents are reminded to keep track of when their child has P.E. class each week. Students must wear gym shoes to school on that day. A child will not be permitted to participate in P.E. class without proper footwear.

MIDDLE SCHOOL SUPPLY LIST FOR 2020-2021

The following list is provided so that you can gather the required supplies. The items on this list are kept to a minimum in order to keep costs down for you.

6th Grade:

- Lots of Pencils. Mechanical or regular #2 led is required, nothing else.
- Blue or black pens
- Colorful pen for grading
- 3 packs of loose-leaf notebook paper
- 1 tissue box for classroom supply
- One 1 1/2 inch 3 ring binder (**No** cloth or velcro binders)
- 6 dividers for the 3 ring binder
- 1 spiral notebook. Only one subject spiral is needed.
- 1 ruler
- 3 glue sticks
- Pencil bag/box
- Bible NIV
- Ear buds or headphones
- *OPTIONAL*: USB mouse (wireless or wired)
- PE class - the student **will be provided a t-shirt at a \$10 cost**. They will need to provide shorts in accordance to the school dress code and a pair of indoor and/or outdoor tennis shoes
- Choir – 1" 3-ring binder
- Band - Instrument in good working condition (rentals can be made through WindWorks Bellingham – contact Mr. Thayer for more info), cleaning supplies for the instrument, Blue Standards of Excellence Book, pencil.

7th & 8th Grade:

- 2 – 1" 3-ring binder (not fabric/zipper binder)
- 1 – 2" 3 ring binder (1 for Math) (not fabric/zipper binder)
- 1 pack – 8 dividers with pockets
- 2 Glue sticks
- 24 colored pencils (need colored pencils for Algebra I & PreAlgebra)
Small pack of fine tip markers
2 highlighters
- A scientific calculator (A TI-30XIIS or similar. Not a graphing model)
- Ruler or straight edge
- Scissors
- Pencils, #2 lead or mechanical
- Pens (colorful ones for grading)
- Large book cover - optional
- Locker shelf-this will help us preserve our books. Lockers will be located in each homeroom classroom.
- 3 packs of college ruled notebook paper or notebook (may need more in the Spring)
- Computer Mouse for easier chromebook usage and something to store it in (optional)
- Earbuds to be kept at school (for chromebooks) - must have a school only pair
- Bible (NIV) New International Version. Students need not buy a new Bible if they already have an NIV Bible. If you need to purchase a new Bible, please purchase a NIV or ESV Study Bible.
- Large box of facial tissues for classroom supply
- 1 container of Clorox wipes –**we understand if this cannot be located or provided. If you are able to find some and can purchase extra for those that are unable to find it that would be appreciated.**
- MS band students need a "Standard of Excellence Book 2" (blue) for your instrument.
- Choir – 1" 3-ring binder

6th, 7th, and 8th PE class - the students may wear any shirt with an MVC logo (like previous walkathon shirts). **You will be provided a t-shirt at a \$10 cost if you do not have one.**

- They will need to provide shorts in accordance to the school dress code and a pair of indoor and/or outdoor tennis shoes.
- Deodorant for school/P.E. only
- A gym bag (even a plastic grocery bag) to keep gym clothes separate

Please be aware that supplies need to be replaced throughout the year. Please check with your child(ren) periodically.

Music Concert Attire --- **All Classes:** Black slacks (no cargo pants or jeans), black shoes with black socks, and neutral undershirts. A uniform shirt is provided. These are required for concerts.

WIAA Approved Sports Physicals --- All students planning to participate in school sports need to have a completed physical on file. These are valid for two years and must be on file before participation in practice can occur.

The student handbook will be available online so students can have a convenient reference.

HIGH SCHOOL SUPPLY LIST FOR 2020-2021

The following list is provided so that you can gather the required supplies. The items on this list are kept to a minimum in order to keep costs down for you. There are some general expectations for all high school students that include:

1. A 3-ring binder; dividers; a supply of college-ruled, loose leaf paper for assignments to be handed in; and spiral bound notebooks for journals and/or note taking. **Assignments will not be acceptable if turned in on spiral bound paper.**
2. A supply of #2 lead pencils & blue and black ink pens. (Please do not use other colored pens or pencils for completing schoolwork. They are often hard to read.)
3. Students will be given an **Agenda** assignment book like the one used last year. The student handbook will be included in the Agenda so students can have a convenient reference. The Agendas are part of the cost of tuition and you will **not** be charged separately for them. Students are expected to have and use these throughout the year.

READ THIS SECTION CAREFULLY

Not all high school courses require the same materials. The general expectations are listed above. Once you know your course selections, refer to the required supplies for individual courses. In some cases you may have the same requirements for more than one of your classes. You need not purchase duplicate supplies such as colored pencils, calculators or graph paper if this is the case. Please note that these supplies do not include the cost of projects students will take home from courses like Home Economics and Woodshop, where they have some choice in what they produce.

ALL MATH CLASSES – A scientific calculator is recommended (Cannot use TI Inspire model); ruler (with metric measures in addition to standard) Note that if we go into remote learning that students will need access to graph paper at home.

FORMAL and INFORMAL GEOMETRY, ECON, & CONSUMER MATH – A compass and protractor, headset with microphone

ALGEBRA II, PRECALCULUS, CALCULUS and PHYSICS – Calculator Information — Scientific calculator needed; graphing calculator may be used but is not required. When electronic graphing is required students will have access to a graphing app via their ChromeBooks thus eliminating the need for a graphing calculator. (Some students may still prefer to have access to a graphing calculator as it will allow them to write formula related programs. If a graphing calculator is to be used, then a Texas Instruments model TI 84 is preferred.) Students taking Precalculus or Calculus for UJW credit need to note that the only calculator allowed as per UJW policy on the final exam is the Texas Instruments TI 30 – any version. Phones may *not* be used as a substitute calculator at any time.

PHYSICAL SCIENCE & BIOLOGY – A scientific calculator, graph paper, colored pencils, metric rulers and a bond (not spiral) notebook. In addition, students will be asked to purchase some safety goggles for lab use. Cost for goggles is \$5.00.

CHEMISTRY– Chemistry students are required to have a scientific (not graphing) calculator, paper, pencils.

SPANISH I & II – Headset with microphone

ENGLISH & SPEECH – 3X5 & 4x6 note cards, 2 packages of each size.

HISTORY CLASSES – 1 3-in binder, 3 or 4 packs of 3x5 index cards

CHOIR / BAND ATTIRE – Black slacks (no cargo pants or jeans), black shoes with black socks, white long sleeve button down shirt for Band. Choir robes provided. These are required for concerts.

CHOIR – Pencil, 1" 3-ring binder

PHYSICAL EDUCATION – All physical education students are to have appropriate clothing and shoes.

ART – Necessary items will be identified at a later date.

WOODSHOP –While not required, students are asked to have a shop apron or work clothes for shop as there are a variety of things in the shop that can stain or damage clothing. Protective eyewear is provided by the school.

METAL SHOP—Students are required to provide their own coveralls and lace free leather boots. All protective gear is provided.

Basic Christianity, Worldviews, Ethics, Apologetics – Students are required to have an *NIV Study Bible*. Please note that this is the Bible given to our 8th grade graduates. For those having to purchase one, the *NIV Study Bible* is a specific edition. Other translations may be helpful as reference but much of the curriculum refers to study helps and references that are part of the *NIV Study Bible*.
